Who's Sleeping in your Bed?

Bed bugs are making a comeback in the United States and they are affecting many colleges and universities across the country. Bed bugs are "hitchhikers" and are often picked up while traveling from hotels and resorts in luggage and laundry. They can also be picked up when visiting friends' rooms or apartments.

Several schools have reported some level of infestation. Penn State is taking a proactive approach to prevent bed bugs from showing up in residence halls and it starts with you. Students need to be on the lookout for signs of the undercover critters in their rooms and help campus sleep tight every night.

How do I prevent bed bugs?

Bed bugs are "hitchhikers" and are often picked up while visiting another student's room or when traveling so always be on the look out for bed bug signs when visiting or traveling.

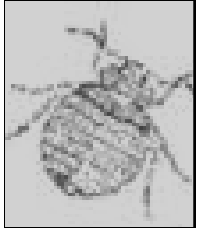
Bed bugs can be carried from one area to the other on or in your clothing, luggage, and other belongings.

Where do I look for signs of bed bugs?

Check bed seams, frames, and the area around the bed.

Bed bugs leave dark red spots in mattresses and can hide out in tight crevices in dressers, bed frames, and floorboards.

It's important to check first and avoid infested rooms completely.



If you suspect you have bedbugs call your area Housing Office immediately. The earlier the problem is treated the easier and quicker it is to return to sleeping tight –and bed bug free.

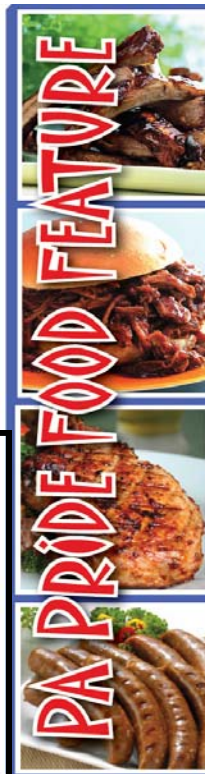
